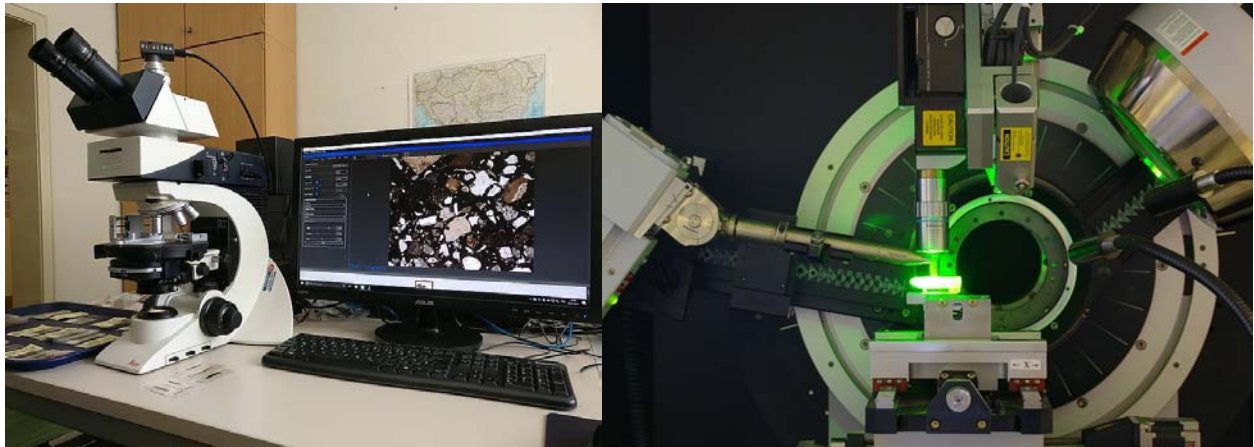

There will be a small fee of 10 euro per person to cover lunch and refreshments, to be payable on the day.

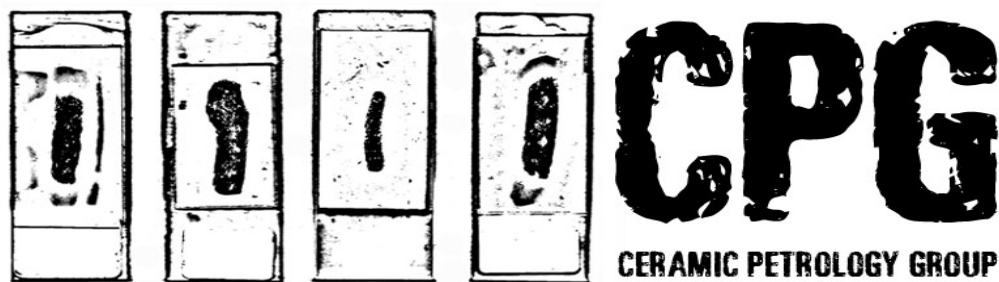

The CPG is a non-formal group of academics, students, museum staff and independent researchers interested in the application of thin section petrology and related analytical techniques to the investigation of archaeological pottery and other types of ancient materials. The CPG was set up in the early 1980's to provide a forum for researchers involved in the development of ceramic petrology/petrography. Today the group has over 300 members from many countries worldwide. Meetings are held on a yearly basis at the in the UK and mainland Europe. The research activities and news of the CPG are disseminated by means of the Old Potters Almanack (OPA).
